There are also Teacher materials (helpful for the answers), a Monkey match game, and a DVD set offered. These are <u>not needed</u> for the class. However, you are welcome to purchase them if they are of interest to you.

Class Description:

This class is specifically designed for our age group of younger kids. Our students will follow Simeon the monkey through the book (and DVD) to learn over 175 engaging everyday Latin vocabulary words for the days and months, numbers, colors, common verbs and nouns, and adjectives and adverbs.
